Team Basics


- Formed in 2015 when variable milfoil first discovered
- Consists of Support Kayakers, Divers, and Weed Control Divers
- Goals
 - Investigating reports of suspicious underwater growths in new areas
 - Locating and removing underwater invasives from known areas
 - Variable Milfoil
 - Chinese Mystery Snails
- Depend on Weed Watchers and Lake Users to report new areas of infestation and suspicious vegetation



Milfoil Amounts by Year

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• 2015 35 gallons
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- 2016 25 gallons
- 2017 15 gallons
- 2018 11 gallons
- 2019 132 gallons
- 2020 74 gallons
- 2021 318 gallons
 - State Park Camp Store 65 gallons (1.5 acres)= 43.3 gal/ac
 - Gove's Cove 121 gallons (13 acres)= 9.3 gal/ac
 - South Channel 102 gallons (28 acres)= 3.6 gal/ac

Milfoil Team

- All volunteers
- Need to provide personal gear
- 2 Surface Supplied Air (aka Hookah) rigs, up to 4 divers
- 6 search divers
- 6 certified Weed Control Divers (WCD)
- 18 support kayakers
- 954 volunteer hours in 2021
- 58 separate dives
- Divers currently search over 60 acres for milfoil several times per season

Scuba Diver Requirements and Responsibilities

- Open water dive certification
 - PADI, NAUI, etc
- Provide own equipment
 - Tank fills, insurance, collection bags paid by PLIA
- Responsibilities
 - Participate in team milfoil searches/removals

SSA Diver Requirements and Responsibilities

- Must have snorkeling or diving experience
- Complete SSA Training
- Provide own basic equipment
 - Mask, fins, weights, wet suit
- Responsibilities
 - Participate in team milfoil searches
 - Coordinate diving with Team Leader

Weed Control Diver Requirements and Responsibilities

- Open water dive certification
- Weed Control Diver certification
- Provide own equipment
- Responsibilities
 - Participate in team milfoil searches before doing any removals
 - Dive and remove only with kayak support and prior notification
 - Provide data to team leader for NHDES reports

Support Kayaker Requirements and Responsibilities

- Comfortable in operating kayak near divers and boaters
- Capable in handling kayak under a variety of weather conditions
- Responsibilities
 - Keep divers safe by managing boat traffic
 - Provide logistical support
 - Provide and retrieve markers
 - Guide search divers
 - Empty milfoil collection bags

Operations

- Dives conducted every Sunday
- Weekday dives scheduled when sufficient people available
- One support kayaker for every diver
- Dive duration 1 2 hours
- Milfoil plants marked with floats
 - Try to remove plants as soon as marked and mapped

Milfoil Markers

- Orange Floats mark known milfoil locations
- Green Floats used during search operations
- Purple markers used by Weed Watchers



Search Procedure

- Search Areas divided into several acre sections
- Generally one area searched per dive session
- Searches done by parallel passes across search area



Search Procedure

- One kayaker per diver
- Kayaker equipment
 - Safety Vests
 - Safety Whistles
 - Diver Flags
 - Extra Markers
 - Garbage bags and nets for removal operations

Search Metrics

- Searching is labor intensive
 - 1 acre per diver per hour
 - 10:1 ratio of searching to removal
 - Estimated coverage 50-75%
- Biggest team need is more divers for searching

Additional Current and Potential Search Aids

- Aerial Drone
 - Very useful in detecting large milfoil plants just after ice out when lake level is low
- Sonar
 - Used to sweep large areas to find potential additional areas of infestation
- Underwater Drone
 - Evaluating potential for future use
- Underwater Lights
 - Will be evaluating this summer
